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Remote Control of a Computer

- There are times when you would like to help someone at another location with a computer problem or remotely operate your computer.
- The term "Remote Desktop" is used in generic way to describe this type of operation. A search using that term will come up with a variety of suppliers.
- A few of the programs that support Remote Desktop operation are:
 - Chrome Remote Desktop (Google: Used by Paul Lewis)
 - Citrix Xen Desktop (used by some hackers)
 - Apple Remote Desktop
 - Team Viewer
- As you will see, one could spend a lot of time investigating all possible choices in detail and testing them.
- This talk begins with a quick look at Apps from the Apple App Store and then discusses Team Viewer in more detail culminating in a demonstration.

Remote Desktop Functional Scenarios

- The ability to view a remote computer's desktop and possibly control that computer can be useful in several ways:
 - Helping someone having computer problems.
 - Using a remote computer yourself.
 - Collaborating on a project or meeting.
- In one scenario, you see a partner's screen, but only have control over his/her cursor position so you can point out where they should click.
- In another scenario, you have full control, but this can be dangerous for your partner unless they trust you.
- In a third scenario you are a participant in a meeting or group design effort and all participants need to see someone else's screen which is shifted as needed and control may be shifted as well.
- Where does one get this capability, free, if possible, but at least reasonable in price?



As a product it's solid and well integrated with Mac environment. All specific shortcuts and features are working. No VNC or other software can compare to ARD (I tried). However, there is one big disadvatage comparing to Windows world - ARD is way too slow. When you're working with Windows machines via RDP you can work near the same speed as if you were sitting in front of that machine. Mac to Windows, Windows to Windows, Ubuntu to Windows all work great via RDP. ARD is 100 times worse. Even when I'm sitting in the same room with the machine being controlled via ARD (same WiFi point) I'm getting very low performance. This is huge disadvantage. You can do basic things, but you can't work remotely.

Looks like Apple Remote Desktop is intended for Enterprise Use. In addition to cost, there are other undesirables such as need to create a separate client installer.

- TeamViewer supports Windows, OS X, Linux, Android, and iOS, and is free for personal use.
- Teamviewer offers remote support and remote management—as in you don't necessarily have to have the remote side set up before you need to connect. Setup is remarkably easy.
- Chrome Remote Desktop supports Windows and OS X (and Linux, sort of), and is completely
 free for personal and commercial use. It's essentially just a Chrome app that you have to
 install in Chrome on any computer you want to connect to. You'll have to be logged in to
 Chrome on any computer you want to connect to as well, which is a bit of a bummer, but the
 great thing is that it runs in your browser, is super-easy to set up, and it's remarkably fast.
- Microsoft's RDC protocol and Apple's own Remote Desktop platform both use existing
 technologies within each respective operating system to give remote administrators the
 ability to connect from anywhere they need to, access their files, troubleshoot problems, or
 work with files and applications as though they were using the remote device.
- VNC, or Virtual Network Computing, is less of a specific product and more of a platform. It
 uses existing protocols to send keyboard and mouse actions to a remote computer, and in
 turn it sends the screen from that remote system back to your viewer.
- Splashtop was initially built for mobile access so it works wonders on phones and tablets. It's free to use on same WiFi network. Server clients available for Windows, Mac and Ubuntu Linux.



The remainder of this introduction is focused on TeamViewer which will be demonstrated.

- TeamViewer has a free version that is simple to use between computers and other devices on a local network or the internet.
- The free version is available only for noncommercial use.
- It requires each party to open TeamViewer and exchange ID and password information.
- It works between computers: both PC's & Macs and some devices as well.
- It can also be used to access and operate one of your computers remotely.


TeamViewer Meeting Screen

If Team Viewer opens with the Meeting Screen below, Click on Remote Control at the upper Left. Note: neither partner needs to fill in anything in the rightmost email panel.



TeamViewer Remote Control Screen

For remote control of partner's computer, click Remote Control in center panel, enter partners ID and password and click on Connect to Partner. Partner should have similar screen to yours with his/her ID and Password which he/she should convey to you by phone or email.




Result of Clicking Connect

- You, the controller, will see a copy of Partner's screen.
- You will see a copy of his/her cursor position on that screen and be able to move that cursor and click to upon documents etc.
- You can therefore demonstrate what needs to be done to accomplish a given task.










Enabling and disabling remote control of partner's cursor.




All Session List Options made visible by clicking on icons at top.
