Home Networks

OR
Yours, Mine, and Ours
With or Without Wires

Why should I bother to extend my home network?

More than one PC/laptop in the house

More than one device needs to print to one printer

More flexibility/mobility for users

"Goes Outta – Goes Inta"

Examine PC/Laptop, Printer: Can they do what I want them to do?









Add a Device by Adding Cabling



Simple: Connect device to your modem with long ethernet cabling and duct tape. \$

Not Elegant




More complex: Connect device to your modem with long ethernet cabling, using drill, cabling tools, and faceplate w/terminals. \$\$->\$\$\$ (outsource)

More Elegant

Add Devices using Wireless

Examine PC/laptop, printer for ethernet port, usb port, internal wireless "adapter" or "card."

How? From PC/laptop's Control Panel, see Network Connections. Does screen look like this?



But what if I don't have an internal wireless adapter? You can buy an external adapter!

Did my ISP give me a wire-only modem or an antenna-ed modem/router?

You're in business!

Or one like this?

A bit more work...



If no antenna, you can purchase a wireless router to connect to that modem with its own ethernet cable.



Cost: From \$30 to \$129+

Home Network FAQs

- I want to share my printer among all the laptops and PCs in my home. How to do?
 - First, "share" printer via "Printers" section of control panel, then "add a printer" to each PC/laptop.
- "Help! My PC (laptop, printer, etc.) fell off my home network!" What to do?
 - Check simplest things first: all cables secure? Power on for all devices? Restart everything. Call for help....

SECURITY of Your Home Network

- What exactly are the threats?
 - Theft of information
 - Theft of bandwidth
- It's simple to keep safe?
 - Yes, use the WEP password that comes with your ISP-provided modem/router or your purchased wireless router.
 - Disable file sharing if you don't need it.

How do I disable file sharing?

Disable it thus in XP (except XP Home):


- Click Start, and then click My Computer.
- On the **Tools** menu, click **Folder Options**.
- Click the View tab.
- In the Advanced Settings section, click to clear the Use simple file sharing (Recommended) check box.
- Click **OK**.

I have a Windows Vista or Windows 7

Disable file sharing thus for Vista PCs:

- Select Start > Control Panel.
- Under Network and Internet, select Set up file sharing.
 The Network and Sharing Center window appears.
- Under Sharing and Discovery, check to be sure that the option for File sharing is set to Off. If it is not, click the down arrow next to File sharing and select the radio button to Turn off file sharing. Click Apply and then click Continue through the warning message.






Disable File Sharing on Windows 7 PCs thus:

Click the START button.

 Type file sharing in the search results window, and then touch Enter.

 Under "File and Printer Sharing", check to be sure that Turn off file and printer sharing is selected.

Click Save Changes.



Expand sections and change as needed.
